Thoughts from Pastor Maggie

Lent is Over, Now What?

As we finish the season of Lent, many of us are feeling reflective and grateful. For forty days, we spent time praying, fasting, and helping others — all to get closer to Jesus and prepare our hearts for Easter. But now that Easter has passed, you might be wondering: *What's next?* The end of Lent doesn't mean the end of our journey. Instead, it's an invitation to continue living with the joy and hope of the resurrection every day. Jesus' victory over death is a gift that calls us to keep serving others and to stay focused on Him.

Remembering What Easter Means

The resurrection is the most important part of our faith. In 1 Corinthians 15:20-22, Paul reminds us, "Christ has been raised from the dead, the first to do so, and because of that, we also have hope of new life." Because Jesus rose from the dead, we know that death isn't the end — there's new life for everyone who believes in Him.

Keep Living Like Jesus

Easter isn't just a one-day celebration — it's a way of life. As followers of Jesus, we're called to serve others with kindness and love, just like He did. Galatians 5:13 tells us, *"Serve one another humbly in love."* So, let's keep the joy of Easter alive by helping those around us — whether that's volunteering, reaching out to someone who's hurting, or simply showing kindness. Our actions keep the spirit of the resurrection going strong.

Stay Focused on Jesus

After Lent, it's a good time to grow even closer to Jesus. Spend time talking to Him through prayer, reading the Bible, and sharing faith with friends. In John 11:25, Jesus says, "*I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me will live, even after they die.*" This reminds us that because of Jesus, we can hold onto hope no matter what.

What Can You Do Now?

As we move beyond Lent, let's commit to living out the love and hope we've rediscovered. Keep serving others, stay focused on Jesus, and share His love with everyone around you. The resurrection isn't just a story from the past — it's alive in us today, giving us purpose and joy. May this season after Lent inspire us to live fully in the hope of the risen Christ. Let's shine His light everywhere we go.

He is risen! And because of that, we are called to live like it.

A Letter from Michael Pettee, Lead Teacher Outlook Academy

Hello,

I would like to take a few moments to share with you the story of the Outlook Academy. But first, on behalf of the entire Outlook Academy family, I would like to thank Martin United Methodist Church for all the kindness and generosity you have shown Outlook. Your graduate gift bags are wonderful, and our students and staff truly appreciate the positive support given by all of you.

Outlook Academy came into existence in 2002, it has a simple mission. To give students who have been suspended long term or permanently expelled from their local district schools a second chance. In 2009 Outlook began providing educational services to the Allegan County Juvenile Detention Center and a long-term placement center, the Cheever Treatment Center. Although our students can be challenging, they are all good kids, who have simply made some poor choices. The original goal of Outlook was to have them return to their home districts if possible. In 2011 Outlook started graduating students, many prefer the structure of Outlook to a larger traditional school. We service students from grades six through twelve. Since that time, we graduate about ten students or so each spring. Some of these students would have dropped out of school if it hadn't been for Outlook and our dedicated (and very patient) staff.

The school is growing, and we are happy to be relocating. Westward elementary school is scheduled to close this spring as students will be attending a new facility in Allegan. Outlook will then occupy the old school. Renovations will take some time, but we are scheduled to move into the building in the fall of 2026. Our current location was never designed as a school and is too small for our current student population of forty students.

Once again, I would like to thank every member of the congregation for your support and encouragement of our students. Too often students in alternative programs get overlooked or are looked down upon by the community. It is wonderful to have positive feedback and support from Martin United Methodist Church.
