A Different Kind of Lent

Lent is a season of reflection and sacrifice. It is a time to give up certain things in order to focus on spiritual growth and prepare for the celebration of Easter. Here are some things that you could consider giving up for Lent, based on verses from the Bible:

Give up the need to be right all the time. Remember Psalm 46:10, which says, "Be still and know that I am God." Instead of always insisting on being right, try to cultivate a spirit of humility and openness to different perspectives.

Give up your fear of failure. Trust in God's plan and His love for you. Romans 8:28 assures us that "in all things God works for the good of those who love him." Embrace the possibility of failure as a chance to learn and grow.

Give up comparing yourself to others. Each person is unique and has their own journey. Romans 12:6 reminds us that "we have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us." Focus on your own strengths and celebrate the accomplishments of others without feeling the need to compare.

Give up the need to have things all figured out. Trust in God's wisdom and guidance. Proverbs 3:5-6 says, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

Give up your fears of the future. Remember Matthew 6:34, which says, "Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own." Trust in God's provision and live in the present moment.

Give up the need to be in control. Surrender your desire for control and trust in God's sovereignty. Proverbs 16:9 reminds us that "In their hearts humans plan their course, but the Lord establishes their steps."

Give up all the non-essential noise in your life. Take time during Lent to simplify and declutter your life. Create space for silence and solitude, allowing yourself to hear God's voice more clearly.

These are just a few examples of things you can give up for Lent. The specific sacrifices you make will depend on your personal journey and what you feel called to let go of in order to draw closer to God.


The United Methodist Church Human Relations Day Special Offering – May 21 2024

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is an important observance in the United Methodist Church, as it marks the beginning of the season of Lent. On this day, United Methodists gather for worship services that focus on repentance, reflection, and preparation for the journey to Easter.

During the Ash Wednesday service, the congregation participates in a symbolic act of receiving ashes on their foreheads. The ashes are typically made from the burned palm branches from the previous year's Palm Sunday service. The minister or worship leader applies the ashes in the shape of a cross while saying the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" or a similar phrase derived from Genesis 3:19. This act serves as a reminder of human mortality and the need for repentance.

Ash Wednesday and the season of Lent are significant in the United Methodist Church as they provide an opportunity for believers to engage in intentional spiritual practices and draw closer to God. It is a time of introspection, repentance, and renewal, as individuals and the community as a whole seek to align their lives with the teachings of Jesus Christ.

Souper Bowl of Caring February 11, 2024
