20,000 Native Americans within
the denomination, this Special
Sunday helps to ensure the
Native American United
Methodist leaders are
recognized and to celebrate
their special voice in the United
Methodist Church.

This Special Sunday was officially recognized in 1988 and has been celebrated on the Third Sunday of Easter since 1989. An offering is taken on this day and is used to develop and strengthen Native American ministries in the annual conferences, and Native American rural, urban, reservation ministries and communities. It also provides scholarships for Native Americans attending United Methodist Schools.

On April 23rd we will receive a special offering for Native American Ministries, An envelope will be provided in the bulletin that morning.



Lue's license will expire in June and she is not renewing it. We are in the process of replacing her in that position with one or two volunteers. Food Pantry Resource

The Martin/Shelbyville UMC Food Pantry is a member of the Allegan County Food Pantry Collaboration. I would like to tell you a little bit of how this benefits the pantry and the clients we serve. They sponsor the Annuals Peanut Butter Drive (February) The Cereal Drive (May) and the Soup-tober Drive (October). These drives are very helpful for a small pantry such as ours. We receive enough of these products that last around 6 months. ACFPC also hold bi-monthly meetings where around 20 countywide pantries come together for a nice lunch followed by a meeting. Hungry for Christ (will tell you more about them next time!) representative chairs the meeting. During this meeting we are made aware of changes that may be coming, opportunities are learned how we can receive food donations, and a time for questions and brainstorming. The meetings are very beneficial to those who attend. They then report to the Missions Committee on what they learned. We send at least 2 representatives each time. On April 26th, the Martin/Shelbyville UMC Food Pantry team will host the meeting. It is held at a different location where we tour their food pantry areas. We are excited for the opportunity to show them our pantry. If you would like to be involved with any of the food pantry operations, please contact Patsy Hoekstra.
