It seems that there are a couple of obstacles that keep us from growing our church.... I think if we consider the 3-P's as obstacles we can better think about how do we grow, how do we renew our efforts to grow and how do we make ourselves more vibrant.

Personalities: We all have one...they are all different. Unfortunately, sometimes we focus too much on people's personalities rather than our purpose and we as a church suffer. I know, it's important to all get along. However, we get so caught up in soothing the sensitive, coddling the anxious and pampering the headstrong that we don't get any of our work done.

Jesus is all about relationships. He is all about being inclusive, but he never let "hurting someone's feelings" get in the way of his mission or his purpose. He irritated people along the way, and occasionally outright angered them.

The Past: If we sit around thinking that our best days are behind us, we are never going to accomplish anything. If we are trying to navigate the future by only looking at the past, we are in big trouble. People remember the 1950's, everybody went to church, the 70's were great...now we are even thinking the 90's were good. Well, we have just gone thru the craziest time I ever remember, and things look better to me thru the windshield instead of the rearview mirror! I am looking toward our shared future of growth, vibrance, and effective ministry!

Probably: If we are looking at projects or making decisions for our ministry saying things like: "Well we can try this, it shouldn't upset people", "let's take on this project, it won't challenge the budget or the keeper of the budget", "I feel like we can do this without upsetting the Ad-Council". "We better not try that...you know how so and so will react".

If we are going about the work of the church with that attitude, how can we ever create something new and fresh. If we worry about all these things instead of about co-creating a ministry with Jesus, we are missing the boat.

I am not saying go about your work and upset whoever you want. I am saying go about your work with a goal of making disciples of Jesus Christ and growing our ministry.

Let's reinvent ourselves so that our best days are yet to come! Let's dream a big dream, let's dream a dream like Jesus.

SCRIPTURE OVERVIEW: David was God's anointed king over Israel. He believed God desired a house, a temple worthy of God. But God wanted David to understand that only God can build things that truly last. Thus, God promised to construct a dynasty from David's family. From this line will eventually come the ultimate King, the Messiah, who will rule God's people forever. The Messiah will complete God's work of uniting all people as children of God, and the author of Ephesians declares that this has happened through Christ. All God's people—Jew and Gentile—are now part of a holy, spiritual temple. In Mark, Jesus shows that part of being a great king is showing compassion. He puts aside his own desires to help those in need of guidance and healing.


