## Evangelism 101 - Conversation Starters

Turn conversations toward spiritual matters in a way that is natural and doesn't come off as pushy.

People invest time and energy into developing their career, their bodies, and relationships, but often neglect the spiritual dimension of their lives. How do you pursue spiritual development?

- 1. Do you consider yourself to be a spiritual person?
- 2. How has this experience affected the way you view God?
- 3. Do you have a religious or faith background?
- 4. I'd like to tell you how I established a personal relationship with God. (Tell your personal testimony of how you became a Christian. Before what characterized your life before trusting Christ. During how you came to trust Christ. After how you are different now.)
- 5. What is your concept of God? Do you view Him positively or negatively?
- 6. Have you ever come to a point in your life where you believed in Jesus Christ as your personal Savior and Lord? Is that something you'd consider for your life?
- 7. Does faith or spiritual values play a role in your work/day/marriage/perspective on life?
- 8. If you could be sure there is a God, would you want to know Him personally?
- 9. Bring a friend to your church then ask: What did you think of it? Did it make sense to you?
- 10. Have you made the wonderful discovery of knowing God personally?
- 11. Do you go to church? If not, why? If yes, what do you like about that church?
- 12. We've been friends for quite some time now, and I've never really talked to you about the most important thing in my life. May I take a few moments and do so?
- 13. Is church something that has had an influence in your life? Are you at a point now that you want church to be a bigger part of your life? What prompted this? Would you want to hear our basic beliefs so you'll know if that fits with what you're looking for?
- 14. How do you think someone becomes a Christian?
- 15. Do you mind if I share the thing I've found most important to me as a dad/mom/employer?
- 16. What do you think about when you go to sleep at night? (If anxiety or guilt rob them of sleep, introduce the peace found in a relationship with Christ).
- 17. Most Americans say they believe in God. What does believing in God mean to you?
- 18. Before I came to know Jesus personally, God was a vague concept that I could not relate to or grasp. How would you describe your view of God? Is He a reality to you or a vague concept?
- 19. If you were to die tonight, are you sure you'd go to heaven? Has anyone ever explained how you can know for sure?

Read through them a couple of times and some of them may really make a difference when you find yourself in the position to share the Good News of Jesus Christ and struggle to start the conversation. Work on your personal testimony....be prepared.

## Knit, Crochet & Pray



### WORLD COMMUNION SPECIAL OFFERING

On the first Sunday in October, World Communion Sunday encourages those of the Christian faith to experience Holy Communion together. The day also demonstrates unity among various denominations in the church. Holy Communion is also known as Eucharist or the Lord's Supper.

Your donations support racial and ethnic students in achieving their educational goals and transforming communities.

Fifty percent of the offering provides scholarships for graduate students from the U.S. and other countries.

Thirty-five percent supports racial and ethnic scholarships for students pursuing ordained ministry (deacon or elder) and includes a mentoring program.

Fifteen percent funds Ethnic-In-Service Training Grant for leadership development, recruitment, training, and retention of ethnic United Methodist persons in leadership positions in every level of the church and its ministry.
