THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR MAGGIE

In today's world, it is easy to get caught up in the chaos and division that seems to be prevalent everywhere we turn. Whether it is politics, religion, or personal beliefs, it seems that there is always something or someone trying to divide us. As believers in God, and followers of Jesus Christ, it is important to remember that we are called to be united and to not let the devil interfere with God's work.

The devil, the enemy, is known for his cunning ways and his desire to create discord and division among God's people. He knows that when we are divided, we are weaker and more susceptible to his temptations and lies. It is crucial that we recognize his tactics and actively work to resist him.

One of the ways the devil tries to divide us is through our differences in beliefs and opinions. He knows that we are all unique individuals with our own perspectives and convictions, and he uses this to his advantage. He whispers lies into our ears, telling us that our beliefs are superior to others and that we should not associate with those who think differently.
