FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR COREY SIMON:

I've been reflecting on Matthew's Sermon on the Mount for some time now in preparation for this sermon series and what I've found (once more) is that there are few words of Jesus more convicting than those on the mountainside in chapters 5 through 7. It needs noting that the words of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount in Matthew aren't exclusive to Matthew, a variant of them can also be found in Luke 6's Sermon on the Plain. Unlike in Matthew, where Jesus is speaking on a mountainside, offering wisdom bound up in authority to his disciples (as the crowd marvels at in the close of the Sermon in chapter 7 verses 28 & 29), Luke presents Jesus speaking on a level place (6:17) which appears to indicate that Luke is not so much stressing the authority of Jesus but rather stressing his humanity. Additionally, unlike in Matthew where we are offered eight blessings, Luke offers four blessings and four woes- four cautions to the listener.

In my reflections on the Sermon on the Mount I also made a realization about the Lectionary, our three year cycle of readings that Protestants and Catholics alike use in our preaching. In our current year, year A (original I know) we are taken back to the basics, to the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus' manifesto of sorts, in which Jesus lays out in detail what his Kingdom looks like. What is notable about our following Jesus up the mountain is not just the placement it is also the notion of where we're led to as we climb the mountain in our Lectionary. After this season (following Epiphany) we celebrate Transfiguration Sunday which also takes place on a mountain, only this time the disciples witness the fullness of Jesus' revelation as he shines like the sun. The genius of it then is that we're led up the mountainside in the Sermon, we witness the fullness of Jesus' revelation, and then we begin the long journey of Lent to the Cross.

The message of Transfiguration is one that we are prepared for in our season of the Sermon on the Mount, we have to come down from the mountain.

As much as we would like to stay on the mountainside with Jesus and set up our tents (Mt 17:4), Jesus sends us down, seeming to tell us that here's where the work begins. As disciples of Christ we are called to be Kingdom builders, people working to see God's Kingdom lived out, to see love become not only our way in the world but the way in the world.

I'm reminded in this season especially of the words of Martin Luther King Jr who spoke of a mountaintop, who told listeners in 1968 that he'd gone up the mountain and seen the other side, seen the other side, a glimpse of the beloved community, one where every life is sacred and every man, woman, and child is blessed. May we live with the conviction that we will see that Kingdom.
