FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR COREY SIMON:

Dear Church,

It would be no great stretch to say that Fred Rogers stands as one of the greatest influencers on my understanding of life, love, God, neighborliness, gratitude, and compassion; and so I find the resurgence of the fascination of his life and works exceedingly rewarding. Mister Rogers seems to be everywhere these days, in the theaters (*A Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood* debuts at the end of the month), in documentaries (PBS' *Won't You Be My Neighbor* was wonderful), in books (*Exactly As You Are* is my most recent read), and television shows that are either heavily inspired by his themes of compassion, love, and acceptance (Netflix's *Queer Eye* comes to mind), or else a direct continuation of his characters (*Daniel Tiger's Neighborhood* is a terrific children's program).

In a world like the one we live in today it seems as though we still have a lot to learn from the late Mister Rogers. While he rarely mentioned God on the air, from the radical inclusion displayed when he soothed his feet in a kid's pool with the black Officer Clemmons at the height of the Civil Rights era to the intentionality and visibility shown in an unforgettable scene of him singing, "It's You I Like" with the 10 year old soon-to-be disability rights activist Jeff Erlanger, the themes of the gospel were present everywhere in his works. Without ever demeaning, insulting, or doing harm he left an undeniable footprint in our collective consciousness that believes we can be better.

And so here at the beginning of November we kick off the month with a remembrance of the dead. All Saints Day is one of my favorite Church holidays as it serves as a time when we intentionally remember those who have gone on before us. I say all this about Rogers as, at the end of *Exactly As You Are*, there is a quote from Rogers which serves as a reminder for us to remember those who have made us who we are. We are undeniably the product of all those we have encountered for better or worse and so we use this month as a time for remembrance of those who have gone on in the Church's All Saints Day and our gratitude for them and for many others in the secular Thanksgiving.

In the months ahead may we be reminded of what it is we're grateful for, may we remember in fondness (or not so fondness) those who have gone on before us, and may we seek to be a better neighbor in all we say and do.
